# From the Pastor's Pen

I am always amazed at how time moves. We all know that at times,

it goes so very slowly — like when we're waiting to finally get our driver's license, or during the pastor's sermon. (Wait...did I just say that?! ③) At other times, it goes so quickly — like as our children seem to sprout three inches before our very eyes, or when we get to spend time with friends or family we haven't seen for years. But what has been brought home to me this year is the steady march of time. While the pandemic certainly made us revalue certain activities and how we spend our time, we must admit that time didn't truly change during the difficulties we all faced. There were still 60 seconds to a minute, 24 hours in a day, 365 days in the year. It's the way we experienced it that shifted.

Harvest time is wonderful – the cooler air; the changing of the leaf colors; the (hopefully) gradual descent into cooler weather. If we rush to get to something we want, we'll miss 'the joy in the journey'. And if we try to put off that which we're nervous about or scared of the results, we cause ourselves undo prolonged stress and won't start working towards healing if we never deal with that which scares us. It's human to not want the hard times to come, but at times, we need them move us forward and forge a better path through the difficulties.

Like it or not, days that we dread will arrive. We may try our best to stave then off, but minutes and hours tick away like clockwork, and we must deal with them. It's better not to postpone them too long, so the problems can be dealt with. And likewise, don't rush to the good stuff. Let it come when it's supposed to, and savor the good times instead of then rushing on to something new. May we take everything in life as it comes, knowing that good and bad will both arrive — but with God with us, we can face all of time with confidence.

#### MASKS FOR GATHERINGS

Starting August 30, the state of Illinois made the decision to require masks for everyone (vaccinated and unvaccinated) in order to fight the surge in COVID cases - especially dealing with the Delta variant. This is to especially protect those who can't be vaccinated and children younger than 12. Per what our church's Health Team has always gone along with, we are requiring people to wear masks for the church's gatherings - i.e. meetings, worship services, etc. - unless you medically cannot do so. This is following what the state of Illinois and our local Health Department states is best for everyone. This will be done until we're told things are better and we're given the all-clear. This is certainly not what any of us wanted, but we are called to help each other and not harm, so hopefully by doing this, there will not be a major outbreak stemming from our church. And hopefully we'll be able to take off the masks again soon! Thank you for your patience with this, and for caring about others and our collective health.

### **WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY - October 3**

On the first Sunday in October, churches the world over celebrate World Communion. In fact, in some churches, this is the only time all year Holy Communion is offered. So on this day, we participate in the ancient ritual that Jesus created for us with millions around our planet.

On this day, PFUMC will go back to a modified open table for communion. We will still have the sealed communion paks available for those who prefer them. But for those who would like to have regular bread and grape juice, they will be available for the first time in more than a year! There will be several different types of bread from around the world already cut in cubes. Pastor Ryan or a helper will (with gloved hands) provide you the bread you would like. Then you can pick up an individual cup of grape juice as well. It won't be exactly the same as before, but we are working towards it. Thank you for your patience as we work out the kinks over the next few months as we work towards taking communion together again!

Pastor Ryan normally doesn't do sermon series as he knows that not everyone can make every Sunday in the series and they feel terrible they don't get to hear all of his wise words on the subject (cough, cough). #### NEW WORSHIP SCHEDULE starting October 3

As Pastor Ryan announced on Sept. 19, PFUMC will begin a new worship schedule in the month of October. After spending more than three months studying the situation, tabulating the results of surveys, hearing what was said at two Listening sessions and other small group meetings, and discussing the options at a special Ad Board session, it was determined that the best worship schedule for the many different preferences of our congregation would be as follows:

- Beginning on **Sunday, October 3**, we will have one Sunday morning worship service that begins at 9:00am. The service will have blended music, and will always be livecast via Facebook.
- On the first and third weekends of the month, there will be a Saturday evening service from 5:30 to 6:15pm. This service will be contemporary in nature.
- On the weekends we have a Saturday evening service, the Sunday morning service will feature only traditional music – Charlie playing hymns.
- The vocal choir will sing on the second and fourth Sundays of the month, while the bell choir will perform on the third Sunday of the month.
- Sunday School will occur from 10:15 to 11:15am following the worship service.
- The Ad Board will review how the worship services are being attended and appreciated at six months and one year. If reevaluation is needed, it would be considered then.

There will be lots of communication about these changes – especially regarding the Saturday evening service. It is our hope that we can attract new people to our church through this unusual offering. We will be communicating through bulletins, monthly newsletters, email, Facebook posts, the outside sign, and hopefully other mediums to make sure people know we have these new opportunities.

Please be in prayer for our new worship options. Although the new schedule won't be what everyone prefers, it provides a good compromise for a congregation with many diverse preferences. The majority of PFUMC wanted a later Sunday start time, two worship options, and there was a wide variety of musical choices. This represents the best compromise for our current parishioners, while

hopefully attracting new people to have our church become their faith family.




